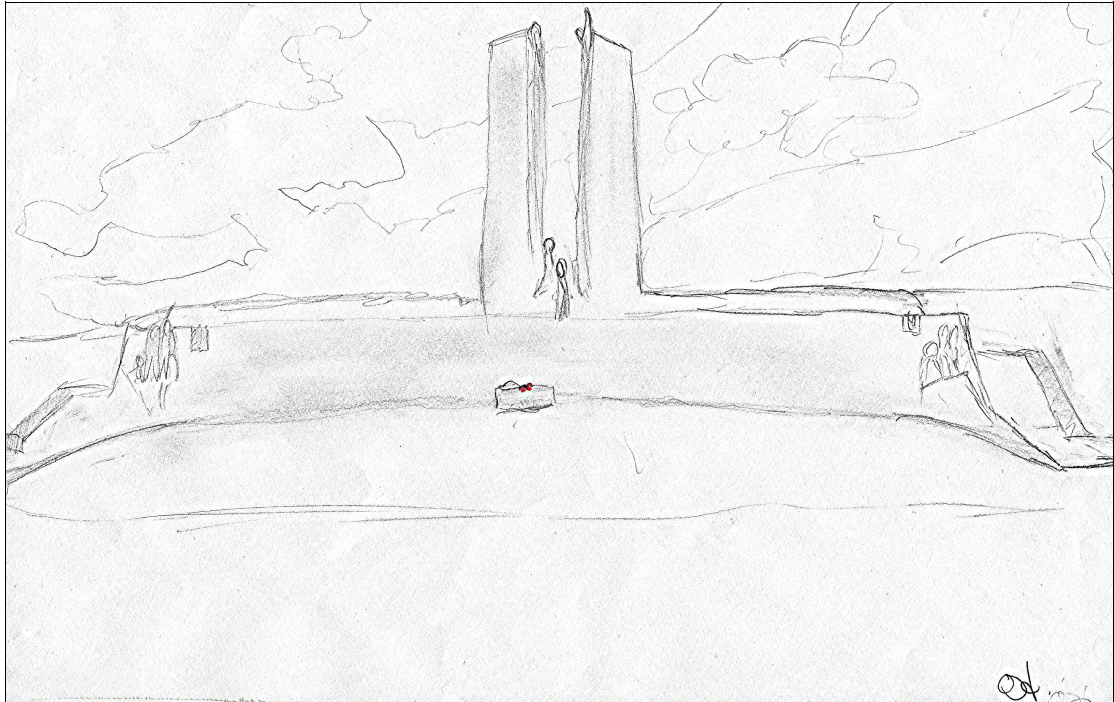

CWM Acquires Vimy Pilgrimage Medal of Edward VIII



On November 30, 2010 the Canadian War Museum announced its successful purchase at auction of the Royal Canadian Legion Vimy Pilgrimage Medal worn by King Edward VIII when unveiling the Vimy Memorial on July 26, 1936. The medallion was purchased for £12,500 (approximately \$20,000), with the support of the Vimy Foundation.

All Canadian veterans and their families were given the Vimy Pilgrimage Medal provided by the Royal Canadian Legion and produced by the well-known badge maker J.R. Gaunt & Son. It should be noted that the medal is an official medal issued by the government, provided to participants to mark their

involvement in a momentous occasion. During the unveiling, King Edward VIII wore one on his suit, which was later specifically commented on by one of the participants.

In his December 1936 article in the *Canadian Geographic Journal*, author W.W. Murray noted that: "His majesty was dressed in formal morning attire. On his left breast he wore the many decorations and war service medals he earned two decades ago, and on the right lapel the Vimy Pilgrimage badge. This was noted keenly by the pilgrims, who were not lacking in appreciation of this evidence of royal thoughtfulness."

Adrienne Clarkson Recipient of 2010 Vimy Award

On August 2010 the CDA Institute announced that the Rt. Hon. Adrienne Clarkson, PC, had been unanimously selected as the recipient of the Vimy Award for 2010. The award was presented by the current Governor General, David Johnston, on Friday, 19 November, at a mixed gala dinner in the LeBreton Gallery of the Canadian War Museum, Ottawa.

The award recognizes one Canadian who has made a

significant and outstanding contribution to the defence and security of our nation.

Madame Clarkson was sworn in as Canada's 26th Governor General in 1999. Madame Clarkson is a distinguished Canadian who has exhibited the highest standards of leadership throughout her career of service to Canada and to the Canadian Forces (CF), as Commander-in-Chief. During her tenure Madame Clarkson gave recognition to the duties carried out by members

of the CF by her visits with Canada's troops in Kosovo, the Persian Gulf and Afghanistan, and moved and educated Canadians on the role of the CF in our great nation with her tributes to the Unknown Soldier and Canada's war Veterans, and their families. In 2007, she became the third Colonel-in-Chief of Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (PPCLI). She was appointed as the Patron of the PPCLI Association later that year.

Friend Publishes Article

FCWM member Bob Fowler has had an article published in *The Canadian Army Journal*. It condenses key material from his book *Courage Rewarded: The Valour of Canadian Soldiers Under Fire 1900-2007* and is

entitled "Courage in Battle: Defining and Understanding the Act." Bob spent many years researching this topic, with encouragement from the late Colonel Strome Galloway and from Colonel Charlie Forbes, both

The Royal Canadian Legion selected as the 2010/2011 Memorial (Silver) Cross Mother Mrs. Mabel Girouard of Bathurst, New Brunswick. She is the mother of Chief Warrant Officer Robert Michael Girouard, former Regimental Sergeant Major of the First Battalion, The Royal Canadian Regiment at Canadian Forces Base Petawawa, Ontario. He was killed when a suicide bomber drove his car into a convoy of military vehicles

in Kandahar, Afghanistan, on 27 November, 2006. He was awarded the Meritorious Service Cross posthumously.

Like previous Silver Cross Mothers, Mrs Girouard was named an Honorary Life Member of the Friends and received a plaque to that effect from Bill Leach, President of the Friends, on her visit to the Museum during Remembrance Week.

Study on the Future of the Friends

As was reported in the last issue of *The Torch*, the Study is now being considered by the Board of Directors. So far, two 'single issue' Board meetings have been held and a third one is pending.

As might be expected, some of the recommendations made in the study have potential, long-term effects and so have raised some concern. For example, a recommendation on the composition

and responsibilities of the Board along with another one to revamp the operating structure of the Friends have been passed to the Governance Committee for further consideration. Similarly, recommendations that would expand the categories of members was initially dismissed by the Membership Committee but has been passed back to that committee for further review.

A number of recommendations

have been accepted by the Board. It is expected that these decisions will be the basis for an Implementation Plan that will be determining what resources are required to achieve them and when they will be implemented.

Some issues, like a revitalization of the FCWM website are already underway and other initiatives are expected to be launched soon. Stay tuned for further developments.

Book Sale at NDHQ

Last November marked a new era in FCWM Book Sales. For the first time we obtained permission to hold a sale in the concourse under NDHQ which links the Laurier and Mackenzie King Bridges. We were most interested in this location because of the numbers of both Military and Civilian employees working out of the Building. Permission was sought through various channels to present a one-day event in the main concourse. Permission having been

granted, the Book Room Team set about selection of material, recruiting Friends volunteers to help with the transportation of selected books, and staffing the event.

Of course, the Building is a secure zone with the strictest security. A list of Friends participants was provided; all went without a hitch. An early start – 6:30 a.m. – allowed the incoming people to become aware of our presence for the day. A steady stream of interested customers was

experienced throughout the day.

The sale finished at 2 pm - getting home through the rush hour on a Friday took priority! Revenues were most satisfactory, plus most of our volunteers had worked in the building during their military career, and quite a few friendships were renewed. Since all funds raised go to support the Canadian War Museum, it somehow, did seem a perfect fit for the Friends to be welcomed to NDHQ.

New CWM Temporary Exhibits

Legion Halls

January 15 to November 20, 2011

Main Lobby opposite Boutique

This exhibition consists of 25 black and white images by Toronto photographer Tobi Asmoucha. Her photos have documented community life across the country and capture a glimpse of the role that Legion halls play in Canadian communities today.

Since the Royal Canadian Legion was founded in 1925, Legion halls have functioned in communities across the country as community centres and social halls. Today the Legion halls exist as a connection to the past and represent an important part of the Canadian social fabric. The role of the halls is changing along with

Canada's demographics; communities that have been bound together from military beginnings are going through a metamorphosis for their own preservation. Tobi Asmoucha's photographs illustrate the role that Legion halls play in Canadian communities today.

This exhibition was developed by the Canadian War Museum and made possible in part by a generous grant from the Ontario Arts Council.

Missing Lives

January 15, 2011 to September 5, 2011

Corridor Leading to Regeneration Hall

The exhibition consists of more than 40 images by renowned British

photographer Nick Danziger. The accompanying text was written by Canadian author Rory MacLean. Together they tell the heartbreaking story of 15 of the families who lost loved ones during the wars in the former Yugoslavia in the 1990s.

Today almost 15,000 people remain unaccounted for across the Western Balkans. This exhibition explores international and personal efforts to locate the missing, and to identify and repatriate their remains. It also acknowledges the suffering of all those families and reminds us that in war there is no greater loss than the disappearance of those we love.

An exhibition developed by the International Committee of the Red Cross, based on photographs by Nick Danziger and texts by Rory MacLean.

Book by Jack Granatstein and Dean Oliver

The Oxford Companion to Canadian Military History by Dean F. Oliver and J.L. Granatstein

The evolution of Canada as a military power is chronicled by two prominent military historians. Entries include concise biographies from James Wolfe to Louis Riel to Rick Hillier; key military-political issues such as the two conscription

crises, war finance, and Canada-US relations; lesser-known conflicts such as the Pig War and the Aroostook War; and more recent issues facing the Canadian Forces, including sexual harassment and post-traumatic stress disorder.

Additional material includes a timeline chart and other historical and bibliographical reference

information.

The book features over 200 original photographs, paintings, and maps, many of which have not been seen before. It has been published in association with the Canadian War Museum, which has given the authors access to rare archival material that has not been seen by the general public
